Study Notes

- Reflect on Genesis 11:
 - In your own words, how does Genesis 11 explain why the nations were spread apart in Genesis 10?
- How did the people disobey God's commandment to fill the earth (Genesis 1:28, Genesis 9:1)?
 - How did their disobedience display their hearts towards God? Their trust in him? Their belief in his protection and provision?
- Read Proverbs 16:9 and Psalm 127:1, how are these verses emphasized in Genesis 11:5-9?
- Why was it 'just' for God to confuse their language in order for them to scatter throughout the earth?
 - How might this act from God inform how he leads our lives?
- What was wrong with the intention of the people for wanting to build the tower of Babylon and their city?
 - How might their desire mirror that of Eve when she was tempted in Genesis 3?
- How does this text display God's sovereignty and desire for humanity?
 - How might modern humanity be opposed to God's plan?
- The people in Genesis 11 did not trust that God would honor his promise to never again flood the earth. They displayed their disobedience by hoarding their resources and staying local instead of spreading out and filling the earth as they were commanded to do:
 - How might their disobedience mirror that of Adam and Eve in Genesis 3?
 - Reflect on area(s) of your life, how might your walk with God be hindered by your lack of trust and belief in his promises?
